SEPTEMBER MEETING - the season's first Town Meeting held on September 15 was well attended even though it was postponed to the 2nd Tuesday of the month due to the Labor Day holiday. Subsequent monthly meetings will be held as usual, on the FIRST TUESDAY of each month.

Dr. Krasnov, prominent heart specialist delivered an extremely enlightening talk on "Your Heart - How it Works" and was ably assisted by Mr. D. Berry, Educational Director of the Heart Association, in the showing of the accompanying film.

SINCERE SYMPATHY - is extended to Mr. Richard Supplee, Board Member, on the sudden death of his wife, Margaret on Saturday, September 17, 1960. All Board members attended the viewing on Tuesday evening on behalf of all the members and in their name, a floral remembrance was sent the deceased.

NEW SCHOOLS - Construction bids for our new high school will be received and opened by the Board of Education during the second week of October. Construction will start during November 1960 and completion will take place in 1962. Approximate cost of construction is \$6,000,000. Construction bids for our elementary school at Lott and Hoff Sts., will be advertised shortly after the high school costs are ascertained. Both schools will be under construction in 1961 - thanks to Mr. Alvin Swenson, our Northeast Phila. Board of Education member.

NEW LIBRARY - Bustleton and Grant Aves., Phila. - Second floor of the North Phila. Savings and Loan Bldg. Tentative opening date is the second week in October. It's a location to be proud of! Attend opening - all Bustleton folks will be there! Watch for opening date! Another League project completed.

TOWN MEETING NEWS LETTER

TEEN NEWS: A pre-holiday entertainment for the sub-teens will be given on Saturday afternoon December 17, 1960 and again in the evening at 7:30 P.M., for teenagers, 13 to 16 years, at the Municipal Building, Bustleton Ave., and Bowler St. A very colorful feature sound movie, also short subjects, will be shown for an hour and a half, both in the afternoon at 1:30 P. M., and again in the evening at 7:30 P.M. The Committee, headed by Mrs. M. Sider, will encourage the teenagers to express their own ideas for entertainment and future activities. This first program will be gratis and all members are urged to encourage their youngsters to attend and lend support in promoting teenage activities so urgently needed.

NEW LIBRARY: Our new (temporary) Library located on the 2nd floor of the North Phila. Saving & Loan Bank Bldg., Bustleton & Grant Aves., was opened on Monday, November 28. We proudly invite all our residents and members to visit the new spacious and modern quarters, headed by a very capable Library Staff under the direction of Mrs. Gilbert Bancroft.

We sincerely thank Mr. David Silver, Library Chairman and his Committee for their fine work.

N.E. SHOPPING CENTER: In conjunction with the present Bus Route 86, permitting easy access to the Shopping Center, the League, through the efforts of Mr. Maurice Lieberman, Transportation Chairman, has been successful in having a free taxi telephone service installed at the shopping center (cor. Welsh Rd. & Roosevelt Blvd.).

VERY URGENT: Haldeman Ave., & Welsh Road members must attend this meeting if they are interested in the League continuing the fight against Nursing Home erections in their neighborhood. To date, the League has spent \$600 in court and legal expenses to prevent construction of both homes. We have been successful in delaying their construction for the past year, however, Messrs. Hess, Ostrow and Cohen, our Counselors have advised the Executive Board, additional money will be required to continue the fight. Lack of attendance at the December 6 meeting will cause the League to assume the neighborhoods affected are no longer interested. A representative group from each section at least, is expected.

NOMINATIONS: Officers for the year 1961 will be nominated at this meeting by the members. Please attend and nominate those you want to carry on the fine work accomplished by the present staff and thereby maintain the prestige of this 1900 member organization.

BRAZILIA FILM: As promised earlier in the season, the much-talked about color film "Brazilia" (new capitol of Brazil) will be shown at our December meeting, after which refreshment, as usual, will be served.
