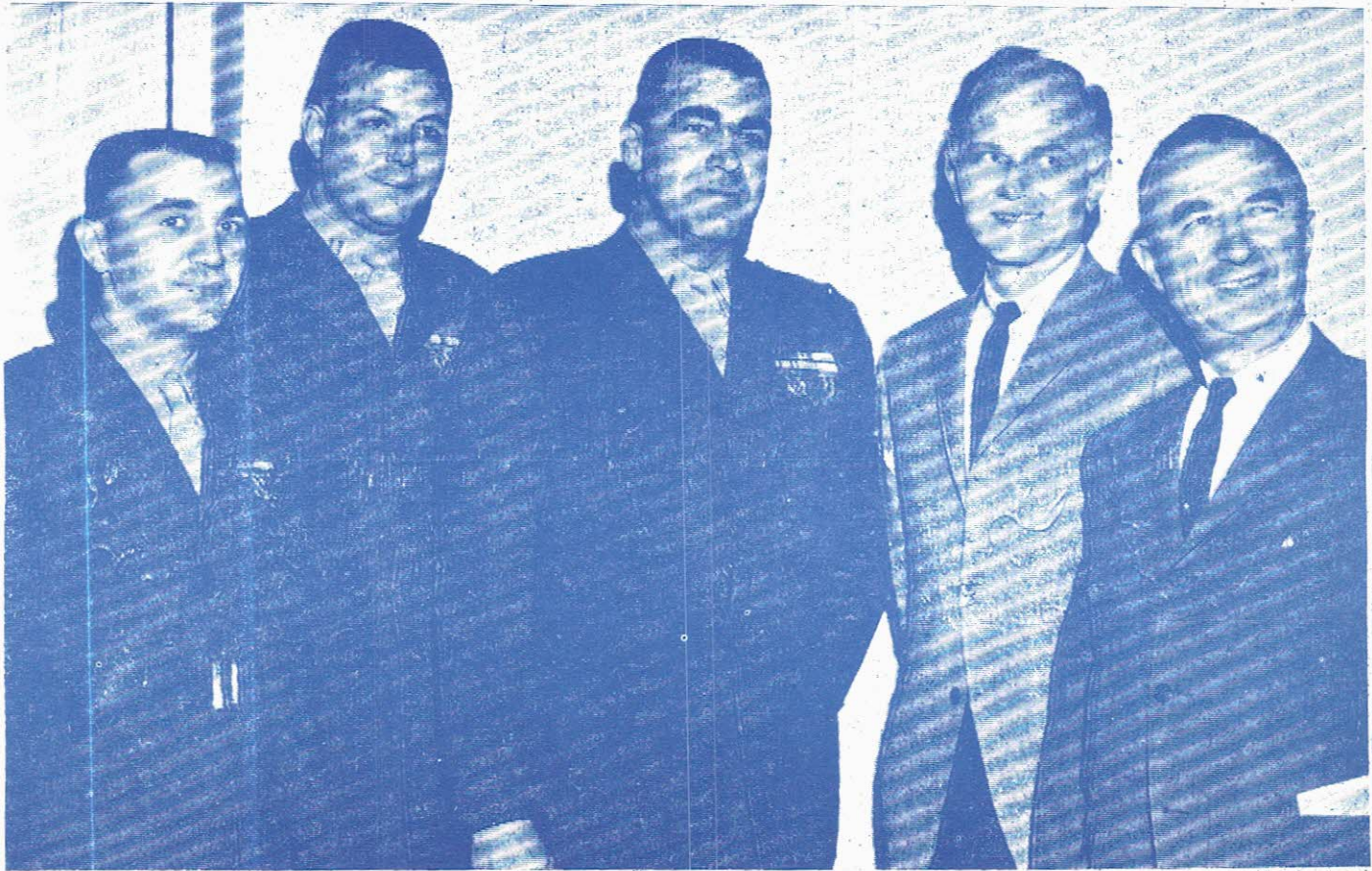


Marines Discuss Viet Nam



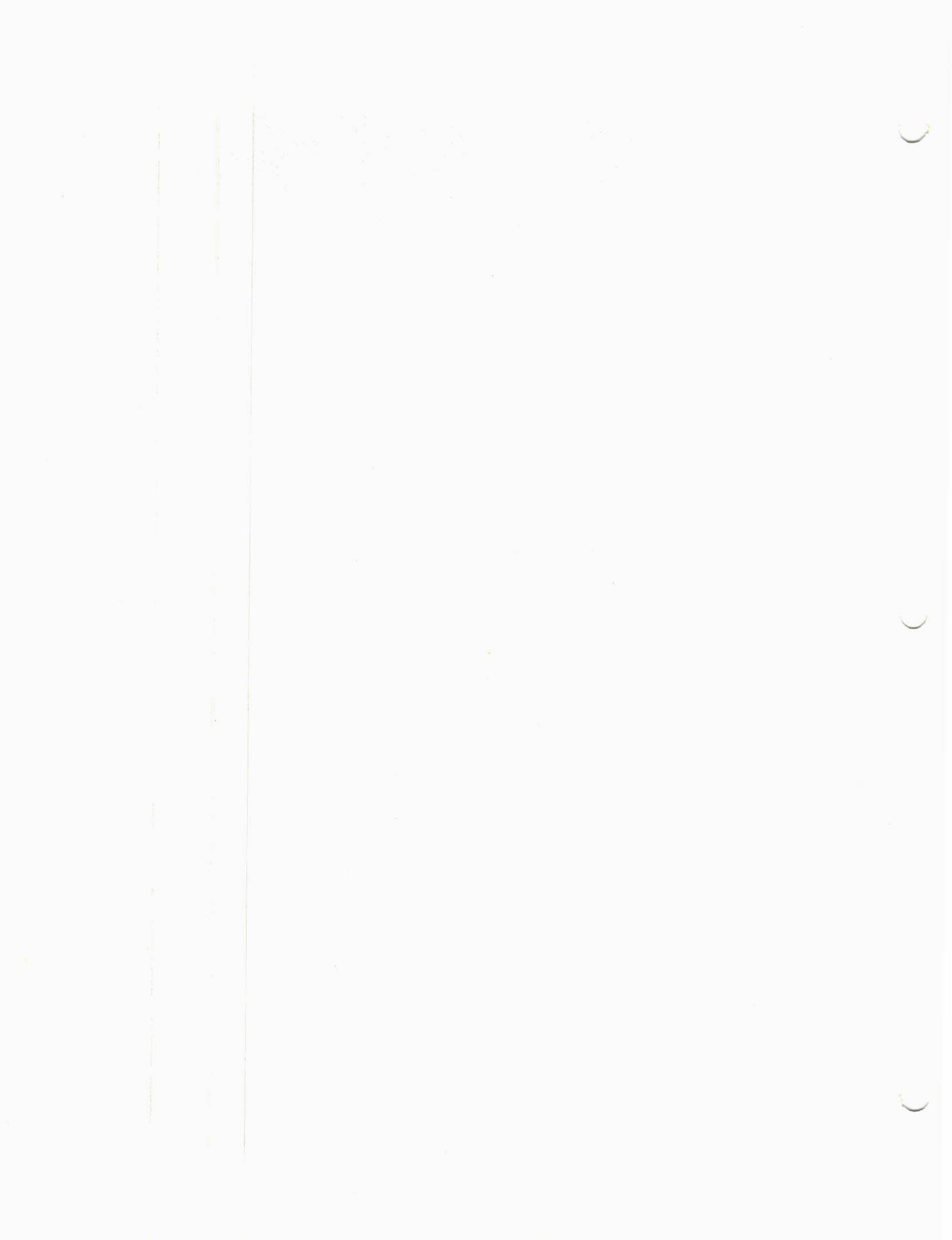
